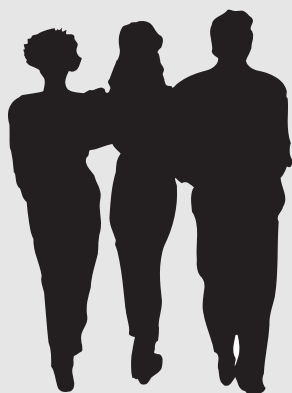


How Lively Is Your 4-H Club?
